Every contingent of young Mauritian recruits for the British Army during war attended open-air mass on the boulevard on their way to embarkation at the port.

It is therefore most appropriate for people to turn to the Blessed Mary to solicit her intervention for the Year 2026 to be a Year of Peace, in spite of the war mongers found in various countries. The irony is that those mongers also pray their gods to help them win the wars of destruction on which they embark, here and there.

It may be observed that the monument of the Queen of Peace at the foot of the Signal Mountain is surrounded by those colourful flowers of the flame tree (flamboyant), known in Mauritius among the people as "Fleurs Banané", New Year Flower. This endemic flower begins to appear annually, island-wide, in December to usher in the New Year. It is with bundles of those flowers that the Mauritian Overseas Gazette (MOG) wishes everyone a Very Happy and Peaceful 2026.
